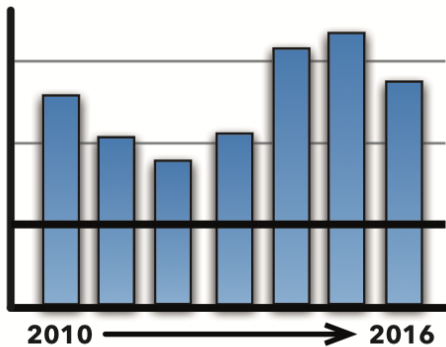

UNDER THE CONSERVATIVES, IMMIGRATION HAS GONE UP

In 2010, with Theresa May as Home Secretary, the Conservatives said that they would reduce immigration to 100,000 per year. On this chart, 100,000 is shown as a thick black line. Total net migration to the UK in the year ending September 2016 was 273,000.

A&E UNITS ARE BEING CLOSED & GPs ARE LEAVING THE NHS

One in seven Accident and Emergency units at hospitals across the country are at risk of closure or downgrading. The NHS are predicted to be £22 BILLION over budget by 2020. Meanwhile, GP surgeries are being closed and more than a quarter of GPs plan to quit.

THE CONSERVATIVES HAVE CUT POLICE TO 1970s LEVELS

The number of police officers has been cut by 13% under the Conservatives. They have also cut police force budgets by 22%. The Conservatives responded to the Manchester attack by offering to put up to 3,800 troops on the street. The number of armed police in England and Wales has halved over the last 15 years.

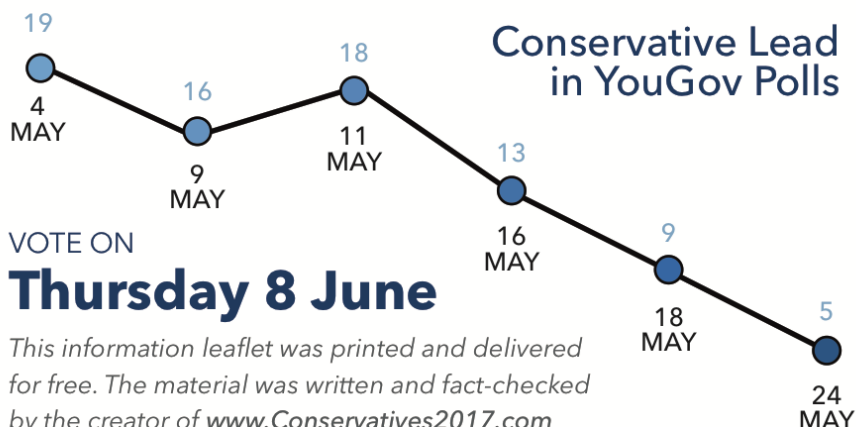
